BREAKING NEWS

An AORN task force reviewed and discussed the literature related to recommendations for operating room (OR) attire, specifically ear and hair covering, and the value of skull

caps as compared to the bouffant, which stemmed from a recent study that indicated the porosity of the bouffant head covering was inferior to the skull cap for ear and hair coverage.

The AORN Guideline for Surgical Attire is currently under revision and will be reviewed by the AORN Guideline Advisory Board comprised of representatives from the task force. The guideline will be available for public comment from Jan. 2, 2019 through Feb. 22, 2019 and ready for publication in April, 2019.

The AORN Guideline for Sterilization will be available for public comment May 9 to June 6. This document provides guidance for sterilization of reusable medical devices. LET your voice be heard as a perioperative nurse and submit your comments.

AORN is already "gearing up" for Expo 2019 and calling all for Session Proposals. You Could Be a Poster Presenter at EXPO 2019 or better yet.... a Conference Speaker.. !! . Have you conducted new research you would like to share with the surgical community?

WASHINGTON, D.C., April 26, 2018 — Today, Dr. Ann Cary, Chair of the Board of Directors of the [American Association of Colleges of Nursing \(AACN\)](#), will testify before the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies. With more than 100 requests to testify received, the selection of Dr. Cary to appear before the Subcommittee demonstrates AACN's strong commitment to elevating the voice of academic nursing at the federal level. Specifically, Dr. Cary will request increased investments in the Title VIII Nursing Workforce Development Programs and the National Institute of Nursing Research (NINR).

These programs received marked increases in the Fiscal Year 2018 Consolidated Appropriations Act, and AACN's testimony will provide a strong rationale for why continued support of nursing education and research will have a strong economic and societal return on investment.

Dr. Cary is a living example of how the federal government's investments directly impact nurses. Receiving federal funding as both a student and securing her own grants later in her career, she has witnessed their power in supporting countless underrepresented, disadvantaged, and first generation nursing students to succeed in the profession and provide exceptional health care.

"My long career as a nurse and academic leader was made possible by an investment from the federal government. In my early 20s, I received a federal nurse traineeship as I was undertaking my master's degree in public health nursing. This traineeship allowed me to pursue my graduate degree so I could focus on a role I believe is most powerful in shaping the future—nurse educator," said Dr. Cary.

Dr. Cary's testimony will provide powerful context for how the nursing workforce and research are essential to reshaping American health care. The system is growing increasingly complex as new technology continues to emerge, cost-containment measures are put into place, and access to quality care is at risk. Support for reinventing health care must be sustained along with investments in scientific discoveries that address population needs and public health priorities. Nurses are key to transforming health care and protecting the health of the nation.

"AACN is honored to have Dr. Cary provide testimony at a time when academic nursing is working with our partners to prepare a workforce ready to meet the challenges of today and tomorrow," said Dr. Deborah Trautman, AACN President and Chief Executive Officer. "We applaud the work of Congressional appropriators who have recognized the value of nursing professionals through their policy and spending actions."

The association will continue to work with our Nursing Community Coalition partners and Congress to ensure that investments in the nursing workforce and research are, and remain, a top priority as the demand for high-quality, cost-effective health care persists.

Professional Associations Collaborate To Review Evidence on Surgical Attire

In February, 2018, AORN met with a task force comprised of the American College of Surgeons, American Society of Anesthesiologists, Association for Professionals in Infection Control and Epidemiology, Association of Surgical Technologists, and The Joint Commission to discuss the body of the evidence on surgical attire. The task force reviewed and discussed the literature related to recommendations for operating room (OR) attire, specifically ear and hair covering, and the value of skull caps as compared to the bouffant, which stemmed from a recent study that indicated the porosity of the bouffant head covering was inferior to the skull cap for ear and hair coverage. In the 2014 AORN Guideline for Surgical Attire, the recommendation is that hair should be covered, though there is not a recommendation on which head covering as it can vary with the individual practitioners. "AORN welcomed the opportunity to come to consensus on the new evidence," said Lisa Spruce, DNP, RN, CNS-CP, CNOR, ACNS, ACNP, FAAN, director of evidence-based perioperative practice for AORN. "AORN guidelines are developed following an extensive review of all literature and the resulting recommendations are based on the quality of the studies. We are pleased that surgical attire is continuing to be evaluated and AORN will reflect the latest evidence in the revised guideline."

The AORN Guideline for Surgical Attire is currently under revision and will be reviewed by the AORN Guideline Advisory Board comprised of representatives from the task force, as well as the International Association of Healthcare Central Service Materiel Management (IAHCSMM), the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA), the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists (AANA). The guideline will be available for public comment from Jan. 2, 2019 through Feb. 22, 2019 and ready for publication in April, 2019.

Continuing Education Program: *Preventing Surgical Fires: A Guide to OR Fire Safety* presented by Ashley Baker, with Ethicon

Ashley presented an interactive session to the group. The main message:

- The risk is real. The number of OR fires is not declining! There are approximately 200-240 surgical fires per year; 20-30 result in serious injuries; 1-2 result in a patient death
- OR fires are often not reported so those numbers could actually be much higher!
- There are usually no patient injuries, not required by law, no staff injury, fear of repercussions, fires are quickly extinguished, no one else is affected, unsure of the reporting

process involved

- Mainly occur in outpatient settings (81% in MAC procedures); most involve upper body (neck or upper chest)
- The Fire Triad needs to be broken: Oxygen (anesthesia), Heat (generally the realm of the Surgeon – ESU, laser, drills, fiberoptic light cords, etc.) and Fuel (the materials used in the OR – this is the OR staff realm)
- Perform a fire risk assessment before the start of the procedure; everyone participates; communicate during the time out; document in the patient record
- If there is a high risk procedure: Verify fire triangle (include verbal confirmation with every); ensure appropriate draping techniques to minimize oxygen concentration under drapes; minimize ESU setting; assess enough time allowed for fumes of alcohol-based prep solutions to dissipate (min 3 min)
- Encourage the use of wet sponges
- Ensure basin of sterile saline or water on field
- Anesthesia: ensure syringe full of saline in reach for procedures within the oral cavity
 - The ASPF has a very useful Algorithm for use for fires on the patient or in the patient
- Equipment safety strategies along with how to respond to a fire (RACE) and fire extinguisher use (PASS) were reviewed

The risk is real! Review your facility's procedures for fire safety, managing a fire in the OR and evacuation of patients and staff if directed to do so. Don't wait until an emergency happens! Be prepared!
